He has been involved in both advocacy and in promoting Canada-wide involvement in World Sepsis Day as part of a global initiative. He is also involved in promoting sepsis guidelines such that appropriate treatments are given even in areas where there are limited resources.		
	Dr. Kissoon's international work has included work in China, India, Bangladesh Brazil and Africa, often in areas of vulnerability and limited resources for the critically ill child. He is fully committed to improving the health care of children nationally and internationally. Part of this commitment has enabled him to assist colleagues worldwide in quality and safety projects and search for new knowledge as well as enabling them to access resources they would not otherwise have.		
	As a recognized expert in the field of pediatric emergency and critical care, Dr. Kissoon has contributed to over 300 peer reviewed publications and authored over 70 book chapters. He has been a visiting professor at more than 75 institutions worldwide along with being a member of editorial boards for 10 journals.		
	Dr. Kissoon was awarded a Distinguished Career Award by the American Academy of Pediatrics in 2013 for his contribution to the society and discipline, the prestigious Society of Critical Care Medicine's (SCCM) Master of Critical Care Medicine award in 2015 in recognition of his tireless efforts and achievements as a prominent and distinguished leader of national and international stature		

as well as the 2016 University of British Columbia, Canada Distinguished Achievement Award for Overall Excellence within the Senior Faculty of Medicine.
